



Dear Old Boys,

The School's celebrations for its 80th Anniversary have passed the half way mark already. In 2011, besides the usual School Opening Mass and Speech/Prize Giving Day, a special Jubilee Mass was held on 2 December 2011 in the Catholic Cathedral, celebrated by the Bishop John Tong with all students, staff and Brothers, together with guests, Old Boys, and friends of La Salle.

The School then hosted a Family Fun Day and Open Day on 18 December, attended by hundreds of children and their parents, enjoying game stalls, displays in classrooms, food booths and entertainment.

Brother Steve's 2020 Plans

Besides the celebrations, in support of Brother Steve's plans for the School towards Year 2020, the La Salle Foundation has spearheaded a Fund Raising Drive aiming for no less than HK\$20 Million(M). Our so-called

"new" school building is already a 30 year old structure, and with many of its facilities just as old as the school building, students today are not enjoying up-to-date teaching facilities as Old Boys who studied in LSC did in the 1980s and 1990s. These include infrastructure, teaching and sports equipment, and computer networks, software and hardware.

In order to equip the School for our current and future Lasallians, some HK\$40M is needed. The La Salle Foundation has maintained around \$20M in reserves, thus the Fund Raising drive would need to raise at least another HK\$20M to pay for all the developments planned for the School.

The 888 Donation Plan

In one of the efforts to raise HK\$20M for LSC, a 888 Donation plan has been launched, where the Foundation invites donors to contribute HK\$888 per month for a period of 12 months, collectively donating \$10,656. We appeal to Old Boys to take up this initiative, to pull your weight to reach the target amount. To raise half of the \$10M target, we only need 940 Old Boys to take part in this program, which we believe is a very achievable target. Please don't wait or look around. Sign up and be one of them!

Fund Raising Walkathon – 22 April

Remembering our War Dead

The month December was not only when LSC informally opened 80 years ago. At the 10th Anniversary of LSC in December 1941, the School was ceased by a bitter battle against the Japanese attackers, which not only saw the then Governor surrendered to the Japanese, but also resulted in over 20 Lasallians and Josephians (St Joseph's College Old Boys) losing their lives while defending Hong Kong. VISIT TO TAI MO SHAN DOPPLER WEATHER RADAR STATION

On Saturday, 5 November 2011, Old Boys and their family members and friends, altogether 50 people, gathered outside the Kowloon Tong MTR station - the usual place - and boarded two 29-seater buses to Tai Mo Shan. It was the visit to the Doppler Weather Radar Station of the Hong Kong Observatory. The radome appeared majestically as the buses ascended the hilly terrain. The Observatory's Assistant Director Sharon Lau explained that the compound supporting the radar was designed in the form of a 四合院. The first busload of visitors was shown the transmitter and receiver equipment before being taken up the stairs to the glass room beneath the rotating antenna. There the scientific officers' detailed explanation of the

Doppler principle was so captivating that the audience, including about 15 children, remained in the nothing-to-see-room for 20 minutes without wandering away. Meanwhile the second busload of visitors was shown some historically significant typhoon radar images because there was no sign of clouds within a 500 km radius of Hong Kong and the real-time images were literally "clear as the sky". After taking a group photo, the whole gang climbed a short steep road to the trigonometric station depicting the highest point of Hong Kong, at 957m or 3,140 feet next to the Civil Aviation Department's radar. Some of us tried to take photos in front of the third radar in the vicinity, but were quickly prohibited from doing so by

military personnel. After thanking and presenting the souvenir flag to Sharon, the group then descended to the Tai Mo Shan Rotary Park. The subsequent picnic lunch included a sandwich, a salad, a pack of chips and a bottle of freshly squeezed orange juice for each participant. Much chit-chat and mingling was achieved during that hour and a half of relaxing rest. Most of the participants were then dropped off at the Kowloon Tong MTR station with the remainder taken back to La Salle College to help out with the Interview Workshop for F.6 and F.7 boys in the afternoon.

INTERVIEW WORKSHOP FOR FORM 6 AND 7 STUDENTS

Jointly organised by the OBA and the LSC Careers Guidance Team, this annual workshop helped students to prepare for their university admission interviews in April 2012. It was held in the Saturday afternoon of 5 November 2011 and 55 Old Boys, both senior ones as well as younger university undergraduates, came back to the School as interviewers and shared their interview experience. This is also a special academic year, so called double cohort year, with both F.6 students (first batch of graduates under 3-3-4 system) and F.7 students (last batch of graduates taking the HKAL exams) entering the universities at the same time in the fall of 2012.

A total of 180 students participated in 28 mock group interviews for the following faculties: Accounting, Architecture, Business & Finance, Dentistry, Engineering, Law, Medicine, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, Science and Social Sciences. There was also a General Group to cater for those targeting faculties other than those listed above.

Two weeks before the workshop, the students were lectured on interview skills during their form masters' classes. They were asked to attend the mock

interviews fully dressed up just like the real ones. Two or three senior Old Boys worked together as the faculty panel and interviewed the students in small groups. Resembling the real interviews, each student was asked to do a self-introduction and a topic was then given for group discussions.

The theme of this year's workshop was "LSC", an acronym for LOVE, SUITABILITY and CAPABILITY, the three key words that we advised the students to bear in mind while preparing their self-introduction. Love – express why he loves the career and what visions, inspirations, dreams and goals he has for his career life. Suitability – elaborate how and why his personality, interests and career orientation are suitable for the chosen studies and career. Capability – highlight his strengths, skills, achievements in academic and extracurricular activities that are relevant to his future studies and career and how these capabilities can enhance his studies and career performance.

Students were advised to demonstrate good attitude throughout the interview process, ie impress the interviewers by showing that they are highly motivated

and prepared to get admitted to the applied faculty and become a professional. This could be reflected in punctuality, dressing up properly, a well prepared self-introduction, good communication with interviewers/interviewees and raising proper questions during interviews.

The students were assessed in terms of their appearance, attire, sitting posture, speaking and interaction skills and eye contact. At the end of the interview, the Old Boys evaluated each student's performance and advised them how to improve at the real interviews. We also helped them fine-tune their self-introductions and the questions they would raise at the real interviews. It was also an opportunity for students to seek guidance in career planning and prospects from the Old Boys. After the interviews, we gathered together for a common sharing session for everyone to get more comments and advices.

We would like to thank Ms Florence Chow (Careers Mistress), her Careers Team and the following Old Boys for their time and effort in helping our younger brothers. All the best to the boys and we wish them every success with their real interviews.

REMEMBERING OUR LASALLIAN WAR DEAD

Christmas is usually an occasion to celebrate, whether you are a Christian or not. The Christmas day 70 years ago in Hong Kong, however, meant something else. It was the day when Hong Kong formally surrendered to the Imperial Japanese Army, at the end of an 18-day battle against the invaders, and the start of 3 years and 8 months of suffering for the people of Hong Kong.

Many men lost their lives during the battle for Hong Kong. Among them were many our own Lasallians. On the occasion of the 70th anniversary of the fall of Hong Kong (December 2011), the Heritage Subcommittee of the OBA has researched and written an article in an attempt to record the fates of those Lasallians who perished during the battle, and to commemorate the sacrifices they made.



Group Summer Camp (30 June – 2 July)

Representatives from the Rover Scout Crew, Venture Scout Unit and Scout Troop will join this 3-day-2-night wild camp together with rovers/ventures/scouts from other Lasallian school groups. This will provide a good chance for inter-section interactions (e.g. venture/scout paired orienteering) as well as section-specific activities (e.g. pioneering for scout troop). Cub Scouts and Grasshoppers will join some inter-section activities on the 2nd day of the camp and the campfire that night.

Investiture and Gala Dinner (17 November)

To make the celebration more impressive, we have dedicated this day as the reunion day with old boy scouts from abroad. We are now extending our open invitation to them through this newsletter and will also separately liaise with overseas Lasallian Chapters. The highlight of the day will include the 75th investiture and an estimated congregation of 350 – 400 scouts/guests present at the gala dinner in the LSC school hall. It will be a memorable experience when serving and old boy scouts of all ages from different parts of the world gather together to witness the function.

Key chains, metal woggles, commemorative stamps and polo shirts will be produced as gifts to scouts and related parties or for sale. Furthermore, a commemorative booklet about the Group will be published for general information. Car owners may be interested to buy a specially designed car badge for display.

The Annual Investiture

The 74th investiture for scout members of all sections recently took place in the LSC school hall. It was our privilege to have honourable guests in attendance: Rev Bro Steve, Principal of LSC; Mrs Emily Leung, Principal of LSPS; Mr Lai Kwok Wing, Kowloon City District Commissioner, Scout Association of Hong Kong and a large number of parents.

Rev Bro Steve congratulated the Seventeeners for their remarkable success obtained during the year of centenary celebration of the scout movement in Hong Kong. Lasallian scouts should possess the virtues of upholding honesty and respect as taught by St. John Baptist de La Salle. They came together like hands and gloves that could not be separated. Further to the Scout Promise in which our scouts vowed to do their best to do their duty to God, to the country and to help other people, Rev Bro Steve encouraged the scouts to observe



this tradition of La Salle in their journey of life so that they would be good men contributing to a good world in which they lived.

Our scout members are recruited from P.1 as grasshoppers to the school levels as rover scouts. 70 scouters in all sections are volunteers of teachers, parents and Old Boys. Group committee members are mostly Old Boys, sons of past and serving members and a small portion from parents so that the committee will hand down from generation to generation. It is for this reason that Old Boys are always welcome to join us for the betterment of scouting in La Salle. 

FORENSIC PATHOLOGY VISIT



On Saturday, 25 February 2012, 11 Old Boys and families, one teacher and 15 LSC students attended the visit to the Kwai Chung Public Mortuary to see the forensic pathologists at work. A light drizzle added weight to the topic but the warm architectural décor of the building nicely camouflaged the inherent eeriness.

Dr Hau Kong Lung, the Consultant Forensic Pathologist of the Department of Health, showed us the dissection workstations, the various laboratories, and the reception rooms where the public can identify bodies of the deceased. This is followed by a powerpoint presentation of the work of the government's forensic pathology division in helping the police to solve complicated criminal cases. He explained in details the different techniques deployed in the process. However not all cases can be solved and there are still cases remaining unsolved after many years. Back in the 1980s they also helped to improve the design of folding tables so that no more toddlers are crushed to death. The La Salle College students were mesmerized by the extraordinary experience of a mortuary, a first time for many of them.

梅州三天行 喇沙英語中心 世界文化遺產土樓 新豐江水庫大壩

廣東省梅州市大埔縣湖寮鎮長教村喇沙英語中心的創辦人馬來西亞華僑廖樂年喇沙修士。廖修士出生於馬來西亞，今年67歲，當過中學校長，1996年第一次走進其祖父1904年所建的祖屋。2001年廖樂年心想北京申奧成功但我能做些什麼？長教村書記對他說山裏缺乏資金請英語老師，於是廖修士就在長教小學開辦起義務英語教學。廖修士後來將祖屋修繕一新以提供更多課室，孩子們不管颶風下雨都準時來到公祠門口上課，近年暑假他一人竟負責教五個班共400多位小學員。廖修士每年除聖誕節回家幾個星期外，十年如一日一心撲在他的英語補習班中。廖修士於2011年獲頒授由廣東省人民政府僑務辦公室主辦的南方華人慈善人物獎。

喇沙英語中心好學的孩子與生於富足香港裏的孩子形成強烈的對比，填鴨式的教育、只滿足於物質需求、覺得被備人照顧、父母庇護、是理所當然的事、港出生率低使老人家好不容易盼到一個孫子。無不寵愛有加，結果塑造了身在福中不知福，自理能力、情緒智商、抗逆力「三低」的「港童」。他們最大的問題是價值觀的扭曲—我的需要得不到滿足，我不能自理，是別人的責任！養生會希望藉着此次參觀喇沙英語中心的機會，為父母及子女帶出一些體會，並通過類似「多背一公斤」公益旅行運動，在旅行途中探訪鄉村學校、傳遞知識和循環再用物資如英文書及文具，使小朋友領悟到施比受更有意義，並可以將普通話磨練一下。

It is with great sadness that Bill Cheng (87) passed away on 9 January 2012 after a courageous battle with illness. Bill is survived by his wife Cecily and three-year old son Brian.

Born in Beijing, Bill joined LSC in F.1 in 1982 after only three years in Hong Kong, quickly adapting to a new environment with English teaching medium. Bill is easy going and well liked by his classmates. It came as no surprise that Bill was particularly strong in Chinese, a rare suit in our days and he was a protégé of the then Chinese subject teacher Mr Tong Wun Sing ("Tong Sir"). After leaving LSC upon completion of Form 7, Bill completed his BBA degree at University of British Columbia, Canada in 1994, and MBA at The Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1999.

Bill started his career at Swire Pacific as management trainee, taking on increasing responsibilities to the position of Executive Manager at Taikoo Motors in the late 1990's, and was a

forerunner in marketing imported cars to the untapped Chinese market. Most recently, Bill was the inaugural Director and General Manager of Bentley China. During his tenure Bentley China grew from annual sale of over 30 cars in 2002 to over 1,600 in 2011 with 18 dealers. It is Bentley's most profitable market in the world after US.

Outside of professional life, Bill was outgoing and enjoyed an active lifestyle. His "Work Smart, Play Hard" motto led to a variety of interests including travelling, scuba diving, stamp collecting and boardgaming. Bill was actively involved in charitable works and supported good cause for the disadvantaged. But above all, Bill was a family man and his dream was to travel around the world with his family.

Bill's intelligence, dedication to work, kindness and generosity will be deeply missed and remembered by friends and colleagues.

APPEAL FROM LA SALLE FOUNDATION

We need to completely overhaul our IT facilities - efficiency is impaired, and the boys can only be expected to work at a fraction of their capabilities on computers. This calls for a total re-wiring of the fibre optic backbone and an overhaul of the switching and wifi access points. In time the School will also need to develop software and teaching aids to cater for the demands of the mid-21st century. We will need to upgrade the audio and visual teaching facilities in classrooms.

On the cultural front Lasallian success has come in leaps and bounds in interschool competitions. No longer are we strong only in sports or athletics. We will need to support the boys by making available musical instruments and bringing in experts to advance cultural development.

All these call for resources, and resources which subvented schools like La Salle College do not generally have. Even with the best financial planning we cannot meet development targets to help keep our boys abreast of the competition. La Salle needs to develop a reserve so that our graduates up to 2020 and beyond will be able to compete for places in the best universities and colleges, and for the best placements in the increasingly competitive world.

We Old Boys have enjoyed the benefits of a Lasallian education. Now is the time to show the Brothers we care, and support their good work, and their plans for La Salle up to 2020.
