昨晚,央視1套和央視10套播出的"2013尋找最美鄉村教師"大型公益活動頒獎典禮上,來自大埔湖寮鎮長教村的廖樂年從今年考上北京大學的學生李展韬手中接過獎杯,在教師節這天收到了"2013年最美鄉村教師"這個最好的禮物。

# "在家鄉教了12年書,全部都是快樂"

"在家鄉教了 12 年書,全部都是快樂。我感覺最重要的是學生們的信心要有,有了信心,他們讀書就能行。我們就是要培養學生們這個興趣、這個信心。"長約 5 分鍾的短片結束後,今年 69 歲的廖樂年在久久不息的掌聲中走上央視頒獎台,面對主持人白岩松的提問,廖樂年如是說。他表示,如果可以,自己将會一直站在講台上,而孩子們上學的祠堂也将會是他們永遠的教室。



"廖老師年近七旬還能堅持站在講台上真不容易。沒做過教師工作的人不了解這份工作的艱辛,寫教案往往比上課的時間還長。"曾在教育一線工作了14年的宋碧榮女士昨晚專門收看了最美鄉村教師頒獎典禮,廖樂年的故事讓她深受感動,她專門托記者轉達對廖老師的敬佩。"廖老師年紀這麽大了,不僅自己堅守講台,還自己掏錢辦教育,贊助貧困大學生完成學業,這樣一份大愛讓人非常感動。"家在大埔湖寮鎮的羅耿傑告訴記者,廖老師的事迹大埔人民已經很熟悉了,但看了節目後依然很感動。

# 山鄉好人山村義教路

1996年,廖樂年第一次回到家鄉——大埔縣湖寮鎭長教村百江,便有種落葉歸根的感覺。2001年,他從馬來西亞一中學校長職位上退休,于 2002年回到家鄉長教村,開始了漫長的義教路。剛回到家鄉時,因

很難得到村民的信任,廖樂年上門找學生,騎着自行車挨家挨戶做工作,每天上門到村民家去 教學生, 周末定期組織免費補習班。

不久,廖樂年帶的學生英語成績總能在班裏名列前茅,本村和周邊村的村民們争相把孩子送來學習,學生從剛開始的 30 多人增加到現在的 400 多人。不僅如此,台灣、香港、黑龍江、福建、湖南、珠三角等地的數十名學生也前來學習英語。祖父寄錢修建的老宅子翠軒公祠是廖樂年的義教"陣地",爲了讓學生們 有個學習的地方,廖樂年花錢精心修繕了祖屋。10 多年來,他在這個祠堂裏免費教出了 5000 多名學生。

除教學外,廖樂年還籌資建設百江村裏的水泥路、路燈等基礎設施。2006年,他動員村民種柚子,先後購買了近萬棵柚苗送給村民種植。

2008年,本報在頭版頭條推出了《廖樂年:英語義教 "總教練"》,大篇幅報道了廖樂年老師的先進事迹,引起了《南方日報》、中新社等國内諸多媒體的關注。今年6月19日,CCTV-13新聞頻道《朝聞天下》連續3天播出廖樂年老師的感人事迹,随後,中央電視台《新聞聯播》更是以4分20秒的時間來報道廖樂年以及他在大埔縣的祠堂學校,讓這個來自馬來西亞的第三代華人成爲全國爲數不多的"最美鄉村教師"。

# "這是學生們送給我的榮譽"

記者:廖老師,在教師節這天登上央視"最美鄉村教師"頒獎台,這是您收到的最好的教師節禮物嗎?

廖樂年:我想,這個榮譽應該屬于我的學生。因 爲這是學生們送給我的榮譽。做老師的都希望自 己的學生讀書讀得好,能學有所成。看到學生有 成就才是最幸福的事情。

記者:在您看來,老師應該擔負怎樣一種責任?



廖樂年:做老師不是做工,是做家長,不僅僅要教好書,更要陪着學生一起成長,教會學生做人、做事的道理。如果老師一味教書,這和工廠做工有什麼區別?培養學生才是正道。老師一定要有愛心、同情心、原諒心,要關愛學生、寬容學生。學生做錯了,我們要讓他們下次不再犯同樣的錯誤,而不是指責懲罰他們。因爲和學生在一起,他們也可以是我們自己的老師,我們要看到他們身上的優點、學習他們的優點。

記者:我們知道您在馬來西亞教了一輩子的書,您覺得在中國,我們現在社會的尊師氛圍和國外比起來 怎麼樣?

廖樂年:說起這個尊師氛圍,這是沒法比的。在國外,老師地位很高。而在中國,存在這樣一個誤區: 學生犯了錯被老師批評,家長便會大鬧學校。老師不能贏得學生的尊重、不能贏得社會的尊重,讓老師不敢教學生,隻能教書。這是非常錯誤的社會氛圍。家長隻有加強和老師的溝通合作,才能共同帶好學生,共同 培養人才,讓孩子成爲一個好公民。

記者:當前,社會非常重視師德教育,您對此怎麼看?

廖樂年:我覺得學校校長的責任很大,不僅要管理好教師隊伍,也要保證學校教學成績。管理好教師, 這是非常重要的。校長不僅要與老師多見面、多溝通,也要走到學生中間,聽聽學生們的看法,聽聽學 生們對學校、對老師有什麼要求,這樣學校和老師會做得更好,學生也能學得更好。(羅娟娟 張柯)

### **Australian Mathematics Competition 2013**

The Australian Mathematics Competition is administered by the Australian Mathematics Trust (AMT) through the University of Canberra and is now in more than 100 countries. The three levels of Awards are: (1) High Distinction – the top 2% in Hong Kong at each Year level; (2) Prize Award – the top 0.1% in the whole competition at each Year level; (3) Medal Awards – the top 0.03% across the whole competition at each Year level. There were 67 Medallists in total this year, and 6 were from Hong Kong.
