La Salle Day Dinner (May 15, 2018) in Toronto

Robert Chow (1959)

From Chris Fong, the editor: The almightiness of the first generation La Salle campus is always admired and missed by generations of old boys. Robert Chow (59, with the microphone) had some stories to tell during our annual La Salle Day Dinner. There is a little bit of historian in me and I was fascinated. This story must be shared among old boys across North America.



This battle from 1949 to 1959 was well known and well documented. It is an important chapter in the history of The LaSalle College. But, the information in the story I am going to tell you was information that was hidden for nearly sixty (60) years. It was ultimately published in Gateway #55 (Jan. 2015 issue) after the editors verified the information was authentic. The official historian of LaSalle, Mark Huang (85), had no knowledge of this information. He came to listen to the story for the first time at The LaSalle Great Hall in Oct. 2016. And he had this comment: "Thank-you for sharing with us your story with regards to working with Major Wall MP, in our school's struggle to gain back the campus. The articles you sent to me have been passed to Brother Patrick, and will be an important testimony to the school's history and your important role in this chapter".





The 2nd World War ended in 1945. If Chiang Kai Shek had sent his troops to re-claim rightful ownership of Hong Kong from the Japs, before the British did, Hong Kong could be a very different city today. So the British continued to rule Hong Kong as a British colony. In 1949, the British soldiers stationed in Hong Kong decided that they needed an Army hospital for the soldiers. They looked around and decided that La Salle College was the only building suitable for their use. So, The Governor of Hong Kong was ordered to make requisition for La Salle College. The initial term was for two years so that the Army could build their new hospital. However, at the end of the two year term, not only did the Army not build a new hospital, they also refused to honour their commitment of returning the college to The LaSalle Brothers.

For the next five years, Brother Cassin and Brother Felix used all their means at their disposal and engaged the 'whose who' in Hong Kong to press the government to return the school to The La Salle Brothers. But, the government just ignored all the criticisms. The criticisms were so loud that even Rome could hear. His Holiness expressed concern. So, Brother Cassin wrote a strong-worded letter to The Governor demanding immediate de-requisition. He signed the letter, but, before it was dispatched, Brother Cassin died. So Brother Felix was left alone to carry on the battle. Brother Felix had no confidence that he would succeed because so many people had tried and failed. He was afraid that they would not get the buildings back until 1997. As he was pacing back and forth in his office, scratching his head, not knowing what to do, he suddenly remembered he had a friend in England, Major Patrick Wall. He also suddenly became aware of one of the students (herein after referred to as 17 NER) was going to London in the summer. So, Brother Felix summoned 17 NER to his office and told him of the situation and difficulties they had and instructed him to see his friend, Major Wall for help.

17 NER went to London in August 1957 and he met Major Patrick Wall, Commissioner for The Sea Scouts in London and Member of Parliament in Sutton Coldfield, where thousands of Scouts from all over the world gathered to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Scout movement founded by Lord Baden Powell of Gilwell. Notwithstanding his busy schedule, he invited 17 NER to his home in London for lunch. After lunch, they sat down to chat. 17 NER told the Major that the school requisitioned by The Government of Hong Kong was intended for temporary use only. In addition, the school had fallen into a state of disrepair. It was hut-like, there was no air conditioning, extremely hot in the summer, cold in the winter, and some leaking rooms on rainy days. He told The Major, in no uncertain terms, that The British Army was not fair to The La Salle Brothers, the parents, and to the students. The army had no right to requisite private property since the World War was over. And even if they had the right, they should honour their commitment and return the building to The Brothers. 17 NER asked The Major for help. The Major paid full attention to what was said and promised he would do what he could to have the buildings de-requisited.

A year later, The Major wrote to 17 NER, telling him that he had asked many questions and had pressed the Government for an answer in The Lower Chamber. But, the Government did not give any definite answer. However, he felt that something would happen soon. A few months later in early 1959, good news came. The British government decided to de-requisite the LaSalle buildings. To his regret, 17 NER left Hong Kong in August 1959, he had never seen the magnificent La Salle buildings after de-requisition.

The 17 NER was me, Robert L.K. Y. Chow. Most of the people, if not all, involved in this battle are now historical. 17 NER could be the last surviving person in this battle. This story was told in the LSCOBA Toronto Chapter, in the dinner meeting on May 15, 2018.
