1. La Salle College 2020 Strategic Plan

Lastly, I am intending to run for the Presidency of the OBA again for one more year. Should I be re-elected, I look forward to improving what we have done for you and the School in the past year, and making the coming year a more productive and rewarding one for the Old Boys community and LSC at large.

LA SALLE FOUNDATION LIMITED UPDATE ON FINANCIAL STATUS

This is a summary report on the current status of the La Salle Foundation Ltd as of 31 March 2011.

The Foundation continues to hold reserves collected from previous donation campaigns that are applied towards the promotion of education at La Salle College and at La Salle Primary School, particularly to support any maintenance needs. Recently we supported the extension of the College premises under the School Improvement Program (SIP) project. In the last financial year the Foundation has supported the re-turfing of the College track and field. The Foundation also operates the Jubilee Fund to support the College's hiring of extra teachers.

The total accumulated balances of the Foundation as at the end of March 2011 stood at HK\$20.94 million (HK\$22.83 million in March 2010) out of which HK\$4.9 million stands in the Jubilee Fund account.

The total Income realized in the period amounted to HK\$0.9 m (\$1.84 million in 2010) while total outlay (including donations) was HK\$2.27 million (HK\$0.6 million in 2010).

This resulted in a deficit of HK\$1.33 million as of March 2011 (surplus of HK\$1.21 million in 2010).

The Jubilee Fund annual outlay for past years has been approximately HK\$1.8 million. The managers of the Jubilee Fund have approved donations which will leave a nominal amount in the Jubilee Fund as of the 2012 academic year. The Directors are planning to solicit donations in the College's next jubilee, on the occasion of its 80th anniversary to replenish the Jubilee Fund.

The Foundation is now reviewing applications from the College for donations to support the maintenance of the infrastructure and the installation of new facilities. These projects include the renewal of the air-conditioning equipment and a realignment of facilities to enhance access to the school building, and promote administrative efficiency. If all current plans are supported, the reserves of the Foundation will be exhausted. Therefore the directors will activate plans to solicit support from the Lasallian family for its ongoing work in the not too distant future.

The Spring Dinner of The 17th Kowloon (La Salle) Group Committee

On 27 February 2011 at Eaton Hotel, the Group Committee of The 17th Kowloon (La Salle) Group held its annual dinner which was generously hosted by the Chairman, Nelson Lee (58), and the two Vice-Chairmen James Chiu (69) and Karl Ng (64). About 95 persons attended, including Rev. Brother Steve, Principal of LSC as the sponsoring authority, Rev. Brothers Alphonsus, Lawrence and Jeffrey, Emily Leung, Principal of La Salle Primary School, Mark Huang (85), LSCOPA President, Humphrey Lee, LSC PTA Vice-Chairman, Eric Lau, LSPS PTA Chairman, Lai Kwok Wing, Kowloon City District Commissioner, distinguished guests, members and their spouses and scouters from all sections of the Group.

In his address, Nelson Lee thanked the support of Rev. Brother Steve and the cooperation from the LSCOPA, the PTAs and all the scouters under the leadership of Ng Siu Wing and Ernest Foo (81). All these concerted effort had enabled the Group to go through another successful year with enlarged recruitments in the number of committee members and scouts. Scouts were again selected to take part in activities outside Hong Kong as in last year and some of them will be sent to join the forthcoming 22nd World Jamboree 2011 in Sweden. Nelson went on to report the following in more details:

- (1) The Group invested over 80 new blood, with 20 of them joining the first formation of the Grasshopper Scout Ring. The total scout members increased to more than 300, ranging from Primary 1 Grasshoppers to Form 6/undergraduate Rover Scouts;
- (2) The reinforced training team comprised teachers, returning Old Boys as scout leaders/instructors and about 20 parents as assistant scout leaders after completion of the designated course requirements run by the Scout Association of Hong Kong ("Association");
- (3) The 2010 Association Awards to the Group and its members were (a) a silver medal to our Group Scout Troop as an Outstanding Group of the Year; a bronze medal each to the Venture Scout Unit and the Cub Scout Pack; (b) Distinguished Scouter Award to Henry Chiu (93), Stephen Lam (89) and Kenneth Lau (98); (c) Good Service Award 2009 to Nelson Lee; (d) 30-year Long Service Medal with 1 Star 2010 to Nelson Lee, Karl Ng, Chow Loi, Dennis Chow and Stephen Wai; and (e) Long Service Medal 2010 to Rowdget Young, James Chiu, Dennis Law, Thomas Law, and Chu Yee Kong;

- (4) The Group Committee also presented certificates/souvenirs to (a) 16 members having served the Committee from 5 to 30 years; and (b) 12 scouters having served the Group from 10 to 20 years;
- (5) The Committee subsidised 17 cub scouts and 5 scouters to take part in the Taipei Exchange Programme in December 2010 for experience sharing with their counterparts. 2 Rover Scouts voluntarily went to assist the poor people in the remote villages in Yunnan, Guangxi. These unique opportunities offered our scouts a wide exposure to the outside world. As an

on-going plan, the Committee would continue to provide subsidies for scout members to reach out to the world. The next major event would probably be the World Jamboree in Sweden this year.

(6) The Group would join the LSCOPA as co-organisers (remark by the Hon. Secretary: Thanks to Nelson Lee's donation of \$20,000 to LSC in his personal capacity) under the leadership of LSC on 5 March 2011 for the project 「歡樂春滿聚寶盆，齊心關懷九龍城」。 Old Boy doctors would conduct medical check-up for the elderly from the Kowloon City District and provide them with free dinner in the form of "Poon Choi" 盆菜 in the College hall while our scouts would also perform service that day to maintain order.

Rev. Brother Steve delivered his inspiring speech (see attached). Presentation of certificates/souvenirs to members and scouters was officiated by Rev. Bro. Steve and Lai Kwok Wing before dinner. Video show of our scout involvement in TaiPei and Yunnan was shown, followed by karaoke of the unforgettable melodies by members. We will never forget

the marvelous performance of Karl Ng singing in Spanish, Japanese and English. We all enjoyed a warm and pleasant evening with delicious food and entertainment.

We strive for excellence year after year. Through the scout movement of La Salle, we hope to change boys to men who can change the world as leaders of the community in future. 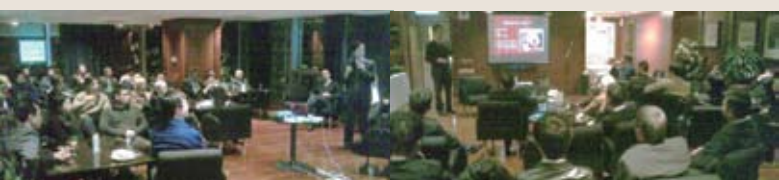
Medical Checkup and Poon Choi Dinner for needy

MEDICAL HAPPY HOUR

On Friday, 25 March 2011 LSCOBA organised a Happy Hour gathering at Club Lusitano in Central which saw more than 40 Old Boys attending. Two doctors were invited to speak about topics of their specialty. Dr Derrick Au Kit Sing (72), the Hospital Chief Executive of Kowloon Hospital and Hong Kong Eye Hospital, spoke about his book 《當中醫遇上西醫 - 歷史與省思》 which received the National Library Book Award (PRC) in 2006. He elucidated about the different approaches taken by Western and Chinese medicine since the 5th century BC. Unfortunately, after

The second speaker Dr Peter Pang Chi Wang (87) is a specialist in plastic surgery and a volunteer surgeon for the charity organisation "Operation Smile". His topic "Aesthetic Plastic Surgery - What you should know as a man" attracted much attention. His silicon breast implant samples were passed around whilst he expounded on the history of breast augmentation and the nomenclature of breast sizes. Finally Dr Pang described the various methods of hair implant for men. It would take two days of surgery to plant 6,000 hair on a chronic bald head. Some 18 Old Boys, including five current medical students enjoyed a Portugese dinner at the Club's restaurant upstairs afterwards.

FORM 7 INTERVIEW WORKSHOP 2011



Jointly organised by the OBA and LSC Careers Guidance Team, a workshop on interview skills for university admission was held on Saturday, 30 April 2011 from 1:30pm – 5pm. It was right after the F.7 students finished their HKAL exams and students could register to attend one or two mock interviews according to their choices of studies in the JUPAS application. A total of 33 Old Boys from different professional background came to the School to act as interviewers, mocking the university faculties of architecture, business & finance, engineering, law, medicine, sciences and social sciences.

The theme of this year's workshop was "ATTITUDE". Students were advised to demonstrate good attitude throughout the interview process, i.e. they should impress the interviewers by showing they are highly motivated to get into the applied faculty and to become a professional, doctor, lawyer, teacher, social worker, etc. A good attitude can be reflected in punctuality, dressing up properly, a well prepared self-introduction, good communication with interviewers/interviewees and in raising proper questions to the interviewers.

Two days before the workshop, a lecture on interview and speaking skills was given to the students by Ms Florence Chow (Careers Mistress) and George Law (66). Students were told to come to the mock interviews in business attire as if they were attending the real interviews. Two or more Old Boys worked together as a faculty panel and we had a total of 22 group interview sessions conducted for about 100 students. Resembling the real interviews, each student would do a self-introduction and the group will then discuss among themselves on a given topic.

The Old Boys assessed the students in terms of appearance and attire, sitting posture, speaking skills, eye contact and interaction skills. At the end of the interview, the Old Boys evaluated each student's performance and advised them how to perform better at the real interviews. We also helped them to fine-tune their self-introduction and the questions they prepared to ask. It was also an opportunity for students to seek guidance in career planning and prospects from the Old Boys.

At around 5:30pm, all students and Old Boys gathered together to have a final sharing session for more comments and suggestions. We also took the opportunity to boost their confidence and to wish them good luck in their real interviews.

A very meaningful workshop to offer face-to-face assistance to our student brothers, this exercise will be held annually. In 2012, there will be two streams of F.6 and F.7 students applying for university admission at about the same time and we will need more Old Boy helpers. Whether you are very young (current university students or fresh graduates) or already experienced in your profession, you can help us. Guidelines for interviewers will be provided and Old Boys who are experienced in this program will do it together with you.

GUANGZHOU TOYOTA FACTORY VISIT

The LSCOBAs' first ever overnight sightseeing tour plus educational visit and family outing mixed with Lasallian fraternity took place from 21 to 22 in April 2011. There were eight Old Boys (from Class of 70 to 89) participating with their families, making a total of 25 people. Amongst the seven children were five current La Salle Primary School students.

The coach departed Kowloon Tong Station at 7:40am and crossed the border via Kong Sham Western Highway to reach the first stop of WangPu Military School (黃埔軍校) before noon. There the group learned about the school's various alumni who are famous in modern Chinese history. The first meal at a nearby restaurant was surprisingly good. The next stop was the new Guangdong Museum (廣東省博物館) which won the Hong Kong Institute of Architects' 2010 First Prize for work outside Hong Kong. At the Museum, the history of Guangdong Province was explained in detail. A photo session followed at the piazza in front of the Museum with the 16th Asian Games Stadium as the background.

The children got really excited when the group ascended the tallest tower in the world at 600m - the Canton Tower (廣州塔). The panoramic view, especially with a setting sun, was breathtaking. A sumptuous dinner was then served at the historical Bei Yuan Restaurant (北園酒家) and everybody enjoyed the famous Cantonese cuisine *en locale*. The majority of the group then joined the impromptu ZhuJiang (Pearl River) Night Tour (珠江夜遊). The millions of lights along the River installed for the Asian Games spectacle could almost compete with those of our Victoria Harbour. The group then retired to the 4-star Riverside Hotel (江灣大酒店) right next to the Pearl River. Fifteen members of the group went into a frenzy and took taxis to a restaurant in the Guangzhou Hotel (廣州賓館) at 11pm to gain first-hand experience of a well-kept cultural tradition in Guangzhou, viz "Yum Yeah Cha" (飲夜茶).

A 7:30am morning call and a buffet breakfast got the group going strong again the next day. ZhuJiang Beer Factory 珠江啤酒廠 welcomed the group with an introduction to the history of beer making, starting from 3,000 years ago to the present day high tech manufacturing process. Of course beer was flowing freely for all. This was followed by another surprisingly delicious lunch at the Asian Games Athletes Centre spotting a huge fish hotpot. The group was then joined by a representative from Wofoo Social Enterprises (和富社會企業), the Chairman of which is none other than OBA Past President Lee Chung Tak, Joseph (69). Wofoo is also the parent company of this tour's operator, the Chinese Youth Exchange Centre. The final stop at Toyota Factory (廣汽豐田汽車有限公司) was the pinnacle of the tour as the group saw with their own eyes how a car was made from scratch. The complexity and precision of the assembly line was just mind boggling. Armed with much "Other Learning Experience", the group then returned to Kowloon Tong Station at around 6pm.
